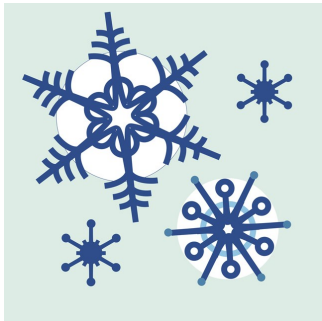

Looking for help with your heating bill?

The 2015 Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program—Subsidy Component begins **November 4th and will end on Friday, December 11th**. Household's interested in applying for the program need to contact their local Neighborhood Center to schedule an appointment. The program is open to income eligible households who are responsible for their home heating costs. Subsidy Program **DOES NOT** require a disconnect notice, a past due bill or for families to be out of bulk fuel. The Subsidy benefit can be applied as a credit on account.. Once the Subsidy Component is completed, the next funding for heat assistance will not be until January 11th, 2016. The Crisis Component will require household's to meet the crisis definition (disconnect notice on metered utility or within 4 days of running out of bulk heat source) before being eligible for financial assistance.

The following is required when making an application:

- 1) **Proof of ALL Household income (Social Security, SSI, Railroad Retirement, VA Pension can ONLY be verified from Award/Benefit letter issued by Social Security Administration and must be dated for the same year as the application is taken. Staff can NO longer verify this income from bank statements or copy of benefit checks). Proof of all household's in-come from the previous month is required.**
- 2) **Proof of present address (e.g., rent receipt, lease or deed, property tax bill)**
- 3) **Current electric bill**
- 4) **Current bill or invoice with account number for bulk fuel (propane/fuel oil)**
- 5) **Social Security cards for EVERYONE in home**
- 6) **Schedule an appointment.** Staff & Automated scheduler will start accepting phone calls to schedule appointments on October 28, 2015.
